

Remote Learning Plan

In order to ensure that learning is continued (irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation) Fibbersley Park School has developed the following plan, which offers remote learning opportunities. <u>We acknowledge that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources</u> (such as pen, pencil and paper) which will be made available from our school office.

Work for children who are sent home from school/waiting for test results

If a child is isolated from school i.e. the child is sent home from school to either receive a test or self-isolate as someone in the household is being tested, they will be offered a 'Year Group' work pack consisting of basic skills to take home or parents can make arrangements to collect differentiated work to meet their child's individual needs. Access to resources by the Oak Academy will allow children to have immediate opportunity to continue their learning.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

- 1. An individual is self-isolating because of a positive test within the household;
- 2. A group of children are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus in the bubble;
- 3. A whole bubble or cohort is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus
- 4. A national lockdown

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document <u>Guidance for Full Opening of</u> <u>Schools</u>.

Software and online platforms

There are also hundreds of lessons specifically aimed at children with SEND needs and requiring additional support.
MARVELLOUS	Marvellous Me will remain in use as the communication element has already proved to be invaluable. Teachers will be able to message parents to share information and offer support.
zoom	Zoom will support school in offering true online learning with the opportunity for the children to communicate with their teacher through live video.
MyMaths.co.	https://www.mymaths.co.uk/ My Maths resources will be used as they are matched to our current maths curriculum model and tasks will be set by the class teacher.
showbie	Showbie, may be used by some teachers to provide work and feedback. It gives children the opportunity to collaborate.



In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by Coronavirus, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is compulsory, as is the expectation that Fibbersley Park Primary Academy School makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning.

Remote Learning

In the case of whole cohort isolation, resources for home learning will be uploaded to our school website and priority children will have packs delivered.

How will we monitor the engagement and quality of remote learning?
