Phonics

We are following the Rocket Phonics scheme.



Phonics is taught daily where 2 new sounds are taught per week.



Children learn to blend help them read words and segment to help them spell.




Children will be taught common exception words which are words we can sound out part of the word but other parts have a less common letter-sound correspondence that may be unusual.







Year I Phonics Screening Check.

01

In June all Year 1 Pupils will be required to take a Phonics screening check. 02

It is a way of checking a child's phonic skills to read words and become a more fluent reader. 03

There are 40 words for the children to read at their own pace. They are then scored out of 40 and you will receive the results at the end of the year.

Supporting Reading at Home

• Find a time where you can sit down together to look at the home reading book.

 Share and look together at the reading book asking questions and checking the children have understood what they have read. The books will be matched to the individual phonic needs of the children so some may have a picture book, a simple book with words, or a book with sentences.

 Please remember it is not a race to get the end of a book band. It is important that the children have embedded skills and sound knowledge before they move on.

 Please read as often as you can, it really does make so much difference to your child's learning in school in lots of other areas of learning.

 Access the online eBook collection to practice different books in the same book band as the books sent from school

The Home Reading Kit

• Red reading diary, each time you read leave us a comment to let us know how you child has found the text. The children get a reading point on class charts which works towards a reading certificate.

• Home reading book.

Common Exception Word Mat- By the end of Year 1 children are expected to read and spell all of these. Please choose a few for your child to read each week and practice them daily as part of their home reading.

Sound Mat to support quick recall and recognition of the initial sounds and to use to support any writing activities they may have.


