The children have now really started following our daily routines and they are embracing our school values and the school's expectations of: 'fantastic walking' 'marvellous manners' and legendary lining up'

This half term we will be learning about different celebrations and why we celebrate special times. Children will also share their own experiences and the things they celebrate at home. Some of the celebrations we will be thinking about are: Bonfire Night, Diwali, Remembrance Day, Birthdays and Christmas.

Our PSHE learning will focus on valuing difference and being a good friend and we will be taking part in 'Anti Bullying Week'

Our Literacy will build on previous learning and we will continue with the Rocket Phonics programme, will be covering the sounds, ck,e,u,r,h,b,f, l, ll, ss. We will continue to practise writing and reading cvc words and simple phrases. We will also learn some common exception words I, the, no, go, into

*Key texts: Room on the broom, The Rainbow Fish, My Presents, Room on the Broom, Simon Sock Dear Santa.

Reading Books: Reading is an integral part of your child's learning and reading stories to your child helps them increase their vocabulary, imagination and helps them to make sense of the world around them. Reading books are changed once a week, if you could read your child's book at least 3 times a week and write a comment in their reading diary, this will help their progress.

In Maths, we will be looking at a number a week, exploring, comparing and thinking about number composition (how each number is made up), we will continue to look at patterns in numbers, encouraging the chn to say what they can see/notice. We will also be looking at shapes and positional language.
